BIRMINGHAM ATTRACTIONS

Barber Vintage Motorsports Museum

The world's largest motorcycle collection according to Guinness World Records, this museum has more than 1,400 motorcycles and 650 bikes on display.

Birmingham Museum of Art

Located in the heart of Birmingham's cultural district, this collection contains over 25,000 objects covering a range of cultures.

Rickwood Field

Built in 1910, Rickwood Field is the oldest surviving professional baseball park in the country. Sitting on 12.7 acres, this park was the first concrete and steel stadium in the minor leagues.

Birmingham Civil Rights Institute

An educational and cultural research center with a mission of educating and enlightening about human and civil rights. 58,000 square feet of archives, galleries, and temporary exhibits.

Southern Museum of Flight

This museum exhibits civilian, military, and experimental aircraft. It contains over 90 aircrafts as well as aviation artifacts, engines, memorabilia, models, and paintings.

Avondale Brewing Company

A locally owned and operated brewery. This brewery is housed in a historic building that was used for a variety of purposes during its history; a bank, firehouse, pharmacy, and post office.

Kelly Ingram Park

Located in Birmingham's Civil Rights District, this historic, four-acre park held the largest demonstrations during the American Civil Rights Movement of the 1960's.

Alabama Jazz Hall of Fame

Founded in 1978 and opened as a museum in 1993, this 2,200 square foot space displays instruments, paintings, quilts, and other jazz-related memorabilia including personal belongings of jazz greats like Ella Fitzgerald.

Vulcan Park and Museum

On the top of Red Mountain sits a 50-ton, 56-foot tall iron statue of Vulcan, the Roman God of Fire. This sculpture is the largest cast iron statue in the world and has been guarding Birmingham since the 1930's.
